## MAG BAY 42 MAKES WORLD DEBUT

[Mag Bay Yachts](#) debuted its latest model, the Mag Bay 42 Express Sportfish, at the 2020 Miami International Boat Show (MIBS). The new diesel-powered performance fishing boat is countering the current high-powered outboard trend by opting for Volvo D13 engines. This decision shows the company's heritage with Cabo Yachts, combined with its passion for building the finest, highest quality fishing vessels afloat.

Mag Bay Yachts was launched in 2014 by Barrett Howarth and his father, Mike Howarth, co-founder of well-known fishing boat brand, Cabo Yachts. After Cabo was sold to the Brunswick Corporation, the Howarths created Mag Bay as its own brand and built the 33' Center Console. The new Mag Bay 42 demonstrates the company's commitment to build a dedicated fishing boat that is faster, more agile and with more range and fishing amenities. The boats are hand-laid using only 100% vinyl ester resin and modern coring materials, designed for strength and durability.

"We wanted to build a boat that was better than our previous 40 Cabo in every way-- a more refined boat that would appeal to both owners and crew alike," states Barrett Howarth, "Using high horsepower diesels was part of the concept. We wanted the ultimate in performance while also providing tremendous range and comfort. We also laid out the mechanical systems to be easily accessible for maintenance," he adds.

Like its smaller sibling, the Mag Bay 33CC, the new Mag Bay 42 features a high-performance planing hull designed by longtime collaborator, Michael Peters Yacht Design of Sarasota, FL. But that is where the similarity ends. "They are entirely different hull designs for different purposes," Howarth says.

The 33' hull is twin-stepped and designed for speed and efficiency, based on one of Michael Peter's patented bottom designs. Peters calls the 42' hull a "conventional, modified V-bottom," meant to be an updated version of the 40 Cabo, and designed to be smooth, dry and agile. Its larger prop tunnels accommodate bigger wheels and a rudder; the keel was removed for more agility and the transom was angled to provide better maneuvering, even in reverse while fishing. Increasing the deadrise and enlarging the chines provides a smoother and more stable ride. "This boat was designed to take a lot of horsepower," says Peters, "And 2,000 horse is a lot of power for a 42' boat!" Adding accolades for the builder, "The 42 Mag Bay is one of the most meticulously built boats on the market," he states.

A bow thruster was incorporated into the hull design and layout and together with ZF Marine's new 400A gearbox and joystick system, docking and maneuvering is a breeze. The engine room is oversized to accommodate easy service for the twin Volvo diesel engines, as well as two A/C units (a 20,000 BTU for the helm and a 16,000 BTU for the salon), a 13.5 kW Onan generator and Seakeeper 6 gyro stabilizer.

Standard power for the Mag Bay 42 is twin 1,000 HP Volvo D13 engines, enabling mid-30-knot cruising speeds and a top end in the low 40-knot



range. Options include 1,105 HP CAT C18s, and 900 HP or 1200 HP MAN diesels.

Ideally suited to serious angling and capable of offshore cruising adventures, the new 42 Mag Bay cockpit comes with two oversized fish boxes, an 80-gallon pressurized live well, storage for 7' rods, up to 8' gaffs and tackle. Fresh and saltwater washdowns with 20' hose reels, oversized pumps and cockpit drains, roomy and easy-access lazarette, rounded gunwales and an oversized transom door, facilitate onboard fishing logistics. The mezzanine provides comfortable seating, a great view of the catch and the Release Marine battle station, and houses three insulated drink boxes, a large insulated freezer box and dry storage beneath it. The 670-gallon fuel tank and 125-gallon water tank provide for long-range cruising.

The air-conditioned helm has a full Garmin 8624 package with dual 24" displays, navigation, GPS, radar and an industry-first lift design for easy access to electronic systems. Two-lever Palm Beach-style controls and joystick complete a clean dash. A "faux teak" helm pod created by artist Monique Richter complements the three Release Marine helm seats. The fiberglass framed windshield provides clear visibility and ventilation for the helm and the L-settee helm deck that seats 4-6 adults.

Below deck, Jessica Mitchell Designs of Newport Beach, CA adds luxury interior finishes including hand-selected wood, stone countertops and soft, yet durable silicone-based leathers. The amidships salon incorporates the largest settee in a boat of this size range and its dual folding backrests provide the ability to sleep four guests in the salon. A starboard aft head is convenient and spacious. An entertainment center with a 43" TV and an electronics drawer with 110v outlets, USB and wireless charging ports is standard. Large hull-side windows provide natural light as do two skylights in the forward stateroom which has two hanging closets and rod storage for 7' rods. The galley features two under-counter stainless refrigerators, a Kenyon stove, GE microwave and generous storage and melds with the salon to make entertainment easy.

Mag Bay will work with customers to personalize the new 42. "We can tailor a boat to the owner's needs," Barrett says, "Hull and interior colors and selections, and tackle center arrangements are all easy customizations. We want to help Mag Bay owners to create *their* own boats!" Hull #2 is currently under construction.


