News from Collier County Sheriff's Office Marine

Hello, everyone,

This month's topic is lightning.

We have received a few questions from boaters about manatee zones during a storm, which we will answer later in the column, but first, here's a lightning fact you may not know: While Florida is known as the lighting capital of the U.S., the Orange Tree community in eastern Collier County is the nation's top spot for lightning.

Here are some tips to help prevent you from being struck by lightning:

- Keep an eye on the sky and radar. With growth in technology, we all carry a remote weather radar in our pockets. Find an application that works for you and you can easily navigate through. Taking a few minutes to track a storm will not only keep you dry but it will keep you safe from a lightning strike.

- Keep an ear out for thunder. It is recommended that if you hear thunder less than 30 seconds after you see lightning, seek shelter immediately. Lightning strikes both in front and behind a storm, so make sure you give yourself plenty of time. If on land, seek shelter in a solid structure like a building or fully enclosed hard-top car. Seeking shelter under a partially enclosed structure like a carport or picnic shelter carries the same dangers as standing under a tree. Energy from the strike can feed back up from the ground or through the object and back into you.

- If you're unable to make it to safety, make yourself small and low away from tall objects. It is recommended that you squat low on the balls of your feet. Spread out if you're with others.

- If you are caught out on a boat, try to get occupants to a safe place in the vessel. Have them don a PFD and go below into a cabin, if equipped. Lightning often strikes the tallest point, so get low. If there is no enclosure, crouch down in a place that is both low and away from any metals. If you are unable to throw anchor and must man the helm, avoid as much metal as

possible and do not grab something metal with both hands. Keep rubbersoled shoes or flip flops on.

In the event of a lightning strike injury, it is important to remember that the body will not store the energy and first aid is safe and should be rendered immediately.

This brings us to the question of whether boaters can speed in a manatee zone in a storm. There is not a clear answer because the Manatee Sanctuary Act Statute and subsequent rule don't provide a provision for lightning. However, local judges and our maritime law enforcement officers across the county, have used the approach of life preservation. Meaning, if a situation of a sudden storm and an imminent threat of lightning is present, then you can speed through a manatee zone to ensure everyone onboard makes it to a place of safety alive. This approach would not apply if you are at already place of safe harbor and are trying to make it home. An example of each would be if you are heading north through the Intracoastal Waterway approaching the narrows and you witness a close lightning strike with thunder within the 30-second mark, you would be able to run a vessel through the narrows to get to safety. However, if

you were at a waterfront restaurant on Naples Bay and a lightning storm moved in, you would not be allowed to board your vessel and run through Naples Bay South to get to your final destination because you were already at a place of safe harbor.
