Is Your Seawall Ready for the Next Storm? Here's How to Know

Living on the water in Collier County is about as good as it gets but it also comes with some responsibility. If you own waterfront property, your seawall is your first line of defense against tides, storms, and erosion.

The problem? Seawalls don't last forever. And if you're not paying close attention, small issues can quietly turn into big (and expensive) problems. Whether you're a homeowner, marina manager, or on a condo board, here's a simple checklist to help you spot trouble early — and protect your investment.

#### Tiny Cracks, Big Trouble

A few hairline cracks are normal over time. But if you're seeing wider cracks, sections separating, or areas where the wall is pulling apart, it's a sign the seawall is starting to fail. Pro tip: If you can slide a coin into the crack, it's time to call someone out to take a closer look.

Is Your Yard Sinking? It Could Be Your Seawall

Notice low spots in your yard, patio, or walkway near the seawall?

That's soil washing out from behind it. It might start small — just a little dip — but left alone, it can cause serious settling and structural damage.

Bottom line: If the ground feels soft or looks sunken, it's a red flag you shouldn't ignore.

When a Seawall Starts to Lean, Trouble Isn't Far Behind

A seawall should stand straight up. If panels are leaning toward the water or bowing backward, it usually means the anchors buried deep in the ground have broken, corroded, or shifted. Leaning walls typically only get worse over time — and fast.

Rust Stains Aren't Just Ugly — They're a Serious Warning

Rusty streaks on a concrete seawall usually mean the steel inside (rebar) is corroding.

If you can actually see exposed metal, the wall's internal strength is already compromised.

And in Naples' salty air, once rust starts, it doesn't take long for damage to spread.

Standing Water? Your Seawall Might Be Under Pressure

Good seawalls allow water to drain naturally without letting soil escape. If you notice standing water behind the wall, muddy leaks, or clogged weep holes (those small drainage holes near the bottom), your seawall isn't handling pressure the way it should. Pressure buildup is one of the top causes of sudden seawall failure especially during our heavy rainy seasons.

Think It Can Wait? Here's Why It Shouldn't

Ignoring small problems now can turn into major repairs — or even full replacement later.

And with how fast storms can develop in Southwest Florida, you don't want to find out your seawall wasn't ready after it's too late.

An inspection doesn't take long, and it can save you a lot of stress, money, and heartache in the long run.




commodore. rogether, the lag Officers will guide the Club's Board of Directors and uphold the values and vision of the PIYC community.

#### Marine Industries Promoting Access for Citizens


